TWIN CITIES SECTION - SIOUXLAND SECTION, REGION 4

Dear Paul:

On September 27, 1979, Chairmen of the above-named Sections and the Director of Region 4 met with faculty and students (attendance sheet attached) of South Dakota State University (SDSU). It was the consensus that service to the IEEE members of the growing SDSU Student Branch would be enhanced through affiliation with the Siouxland Section.

Since the majority of the IEEE members in Brookings and Kingsbury counties, South Dakota, are members or active in the SDSU Student Branch, it was recommended to transfer these counties from the Twin Cities to the Siouxland Section. This transfer will establish the first student branch in the Siouxland Section. Affiliation with the ECPD accredited EE curriculum at the regionally accredited South Dakota State University is expected to provide enhanced benefits to IEEE members in the Siouxland Section.

Hence, the undersigned petition the Regional Activities Board to approve the transfer of Brookings and Kingsbury counties, South Dakota, from the Twin Cities Section to the Siouxland Section; to direct the Staff-Director IEEE Field Services to make the necessary changes in the Institute records; and to endorse, in concept, applicable changes in the bylaws of the affected sections.

rare animal indeed. Engineering is considered by many to be a stepping stone into management — after all, cultivating managerial skills is more stable than keeping up with today's technology. Some engineers felt that engineering may be a dead end street for those men whose experience may have priced them out of the market. "Try not to appear over-qualified," was the frequent piece of advice to the 20-year veteran.

One engineering executive stated that he regarded the first ten years of an engineering career as invaluable training and discipline. "You can look at engineering," he says, "as a beginning for anything you want to do." For example, he points out that for a disciplined engineering mind, there is no problem in

learning the details of business or finance.

The moral of this study is beware of the 20-year mark in your engineering career and be ready for a possible transition into other work areas.

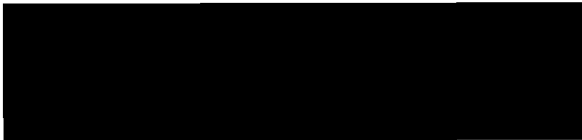

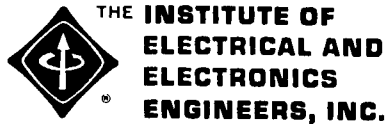

Gentlemen:

Some of the Presidents and Chairmen of various engineering societies in Minnesota, or their representatives, have been meeting informally discussing the organization of a group to provide liaison with the News Media, PCA and other Governmental units. We met again on March 1, and formed a plan of action. SETAC was born. A copy of our plan and the minutes of the March 1 meeting are enclosed.

We will meet again at the Normandy Hotel in Minneapolis, Thursday, April 12, 1973, at 6:00 PM. Dinner is \$4.50 plus tip and tax. Free parking. Social hour 5:30 PM. We would like you to join us!

We are asking each Society to explain SETAC to its members or executive committee and then ratify participation in SETAC. We had hoped to have answers back by the April 12 meeting. Participation would include:

- (1) A representative to work on SETAC and a committee to work with him.
- (2) A vote on the operation of SETAC.
- (3) Use of the Society name in SETAC work and inclusion of the Society name on the letterhead.
- (4) Financial commitment (\$10 a year for each Society plus more on a per member basis if needed).

It is our intention to obtain ratification of as many societies as would like to participate, then call a press conference to announce our formation and purposes. We would then meet with the heads of certain governmental agencies to discuss our relationship with them.



The name "Scientists and Engineers Technological Assessment Committee" (SETAC) "Serving the Public, News Media and Government" was adopted. The detailed mission and mission methods were discussed and adopted. A copy is attached to these minutes.

It was agreed that each technical society in Minnesota should explain SETAC to their own Society and then pass a resolution to participate in SETAC.

Participation would include appointing a representative to work on SETAC and a committee to work with him, a vote on the operation of SETAC, the use of the Society name in SETAC work, inclusion of the Society name on the SETAC letter-head and a certain financial responsibility. It was felt that SETAC's major expenses would be mailing and duplicating and that \$100 - \$250 per year would cover the operating costs depending on the number of Societies involved. It was suggested that each society contribute \$10 initially. If additional funding would be necessary then we would ask for contributions based on the number of members in the organization.

SETAC's purposes will be to:

1. Promote the use of scientific rather than adversary truth in matters before Governmental Groups relating to engineering and science.
2. Promote the system approach to the investigation of technical problems as related to society and to challenge all concerned to investigate and announce the side effects on alternatives proposed.
3. Assure proper technological assessment of matters before agency and legislative groups relating to engineering and science.
4. Obtain information on governmental hearings and meetings having scientific or engineering implication for the public and forward this information to the appropriate state technical society or societies for their review, comment, and position.
5. Establish a Technical Information Service to assist news media editors in maintaining accuracy in their reporting of matters relating to engineering and science.
6. Provide advisory assistance and service to any editor, program director, governmental or citizens group.
7. Arrange for comments and/or positions to be presented to Governmental Groups and/or the general public.

SETAC Mission Methods:

1. Set up organization to:
  - A. Obtain meeting agenda, minutes, and reports of Governmental Groups.
  - B. Distribute data to appropriate technical societies and hence to appropriate committees within the society for comment.
  - C. Coordinate comment returns or presentation before Governmental Groups.
  - D. Give Technical Information Service (TIS) for news media editors.
    1. Universal phone number (MPSE?)
    2. Names of technical society for rapid referral.
    3. Names of alternates.
    4. Each society also organize its own specialty groups if necessary.
2. Report back on progress April 12.
3. Lunch with King for his comments.
4. Notify Merritt, Anderson, -----.
5. Notify Minnesota Newspaper Association.
6. Notify Minnesota Broadcasters Association.
7. Setup personnel to monitor agencies -- MSPE, CEC, Execs.
8. Finance.

The chairman apologized for the late meeting notice and for the incomplete mailing. This condition is being corrected.

The past history of the disagreement between the Pollution Control Agency and the engineers that led to the organization of the committee was discussed. It was agreed that the committee should be officially organized and that Jack Thorson and Charles Britzius should be Chairman and Secretary or vice-versa.

The objectives of the committee as outlined in the meeting notice were discussed. It was agreed that the committee might have to be more militant than indicated so another objective was added: #5 "Fairly represent the interest of the Public at Agency Meetings and Public Hearings." A number of items of disagreement with the PCA were discussed. One group related to their relation to consulting engineers concerning accepting plans from nonregistered engineers, slow plan review, vague guidelines for plan preparation, appeal procedures, etc. An opinion was expressed that the Director of PCA should be selected by the Agency and another that the Executive Director be an engineer within the State classified civil service.

The Chairman was requested to write the PCA Director telling him of the organization of the committee.

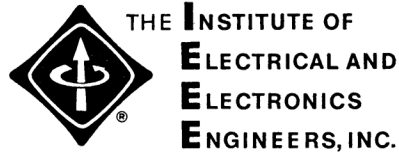
It was agreed that we would attend Agency meetings starting February 12, 1973.

After the meeting the temporary chairman met with Jack Thorson concerning acting as Chairman. It was agreed that Dean Kleinschmidt should be a member of the executive committee, and it was decided that Dean Kleinschmidt would be Chairman, Charles Britzius Vice Chairman, and Jack Thorson secretary.
