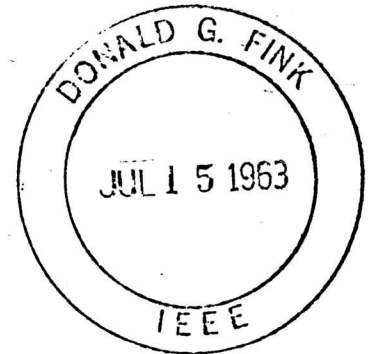

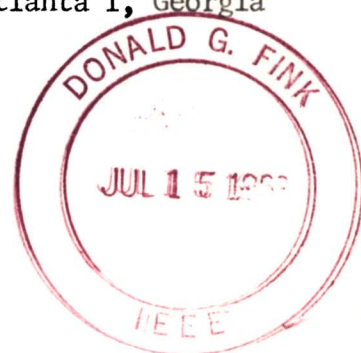


This section will be organized with territorial assignments

5. Unless otherwise advised the following local bylaws will be in effect upon implementation of the LOUISVILLE Section IEEE

a. Fiscal Year - of the Section is established to run 1 July thru 30 June of the following year.

b. Annual Meeting - will be in June of each year.

c. Number of Meetings - a minimum of ten (10) monthly meetings will be held annually.

d. Election - will be conducted in accordance with the constitution set forth in the IEEE Sections Manual. Election to section offices below Chairman does not establish by implication or otherwise any pre-emptive rights of progression thru the offices. (eg. Secretary become Vice-Chairman at next election, etc.)

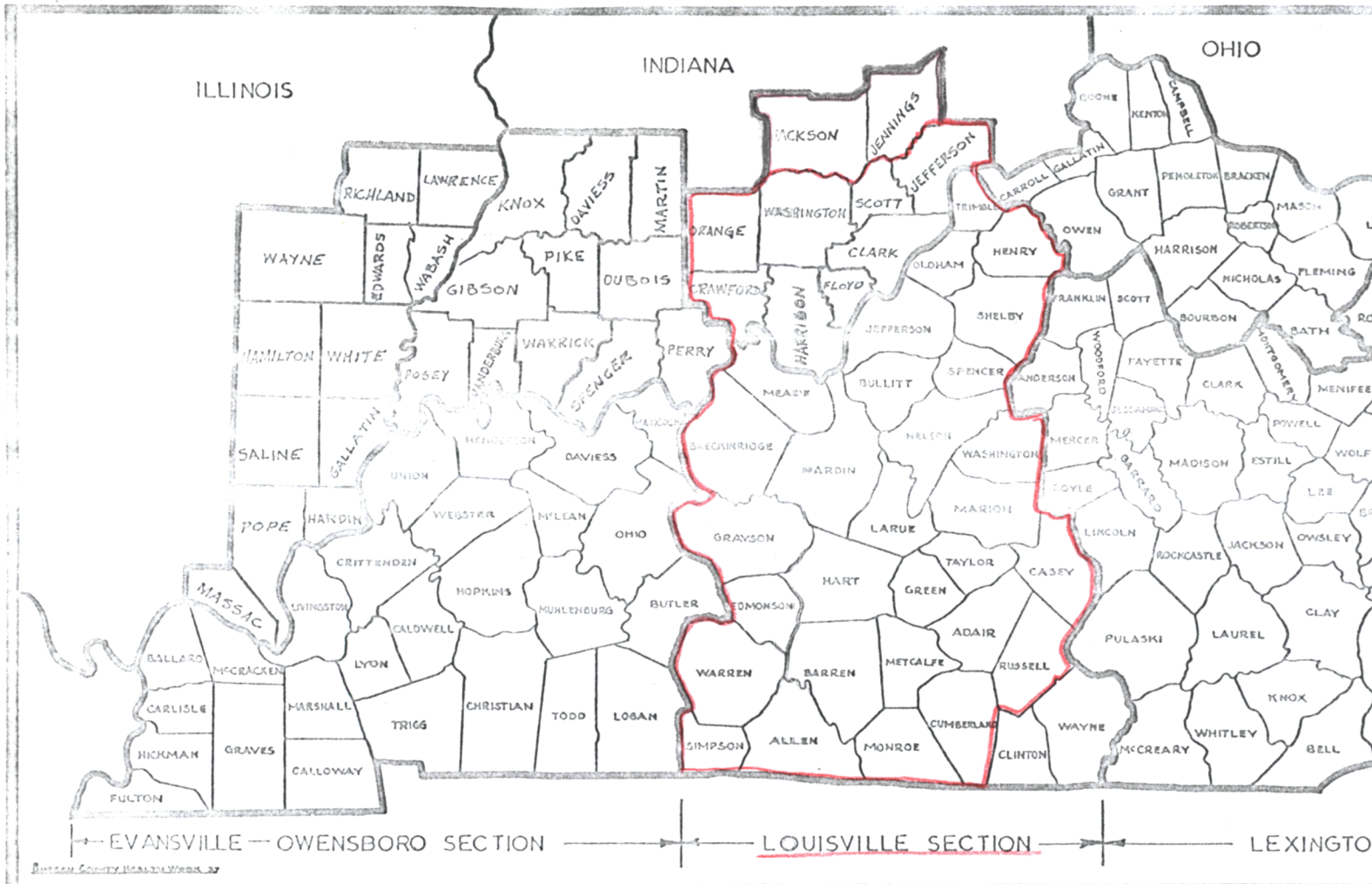

LOUISVILLE SECTION

INSTITUTE OF ELECTRICAL AND ELECTRONIC ENGINEERS

BY-LAWS

(Proposed August 28, 1962)

NAME

Sec. 1. This organization shall be known as the Louisville Section of the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers.

MEMBERSHIP

Sec. 2. All Fellows, Senior Members, and Members of the Institute, residing within the territory of the Section, shall be entitled to membership and to all the privileges of the Section, including the right to vote and to hold office.

Sec. 3. Non-members of the Institute may become Local Members of the Section under conditions prescribed by the Executive Committee.

Sec. 4. Local Members and Associates of the Institute shall be entitled to all of the privileges of the Section excepting the right to vote and to hold office. Local members are not entitled to receive Institute publications.

Sec. 5. Application for Local Membership shall be made in a form prescribed by the Executive Committee.

Sec. 6. Enrolled Students of the Institute shall be entitled to the privileges of receiving notices of and attending meetings; but they shall not have the right to vote. Such students shall be required to enroll with the Section's Secretary in order to be placed on the mailing list.

OFFICERS

Sec. 7. The officers of the Section shall be a Chairman, Chairman-Elect, Secretary, Treasurer, and an Executive Committee, all of whom shall hold office for one year beginning on date of election with the exception of the Chairman, who at the expiration of the term for which he is elected shall, as Junior Past-Chairman, be a member, ex-officio, of the Executive Committee for the following year. All officers shall be eligible for re-election. They must be Fellows, Senior Members, or Members of the Institute.

Sec. 8. The Executive Committee shall consist of the Chairman, Chairman-Elect, the Past-Chairman (ex-officio), Secretary, Treasurer, Chairman of the Student Branch, and five (5) additional members. The Executive Committee shall be the governing body of the Section, and shall direct the management of its affairs. It shall meet at such times as may be found necessary. Meetings may be called at any time upon the request of the Chairman or of three members of the committee.

Sec. 9. The Chairman shall have general supervision of the affairs of the section, under the Executive Committee. He shall preside at meetings, and shall perform such other duties and have such other powers as may be provided for in these by-laws, or as may be delegated to him by the vote of the Section. In his absence his duties may be performed by the Chairman-Elect or any other member of the Executive Committee.

Sec. 10. The Chairman-Elect shall be the ranking officer after the Chairman and shall preside in his absence. He shall assist the Chairman in conducting the sections business. The Chairman-Elect will succeed the Chairman automatically at the end of the Section fiscal year.

Sec. 11. The Secretary shall perform the duties usually devolving upon the office of Secretary of an organization. In addition, he shall report to the Secretary of the Institute the proceedings of all meetings, within a reasonable time after each meeting. He shall have such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Executive Committee.

Sec. 12. The Treasurer shall handle and be responsible to the Executive Committee for the finances of the Section and shall render monthly to the Secretary of the Institute an account of such expenses as are chargeable to the Institute Treasury. He shall have such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Executive Committee.

Sec. 13. The (5) five additional members of the Executive Committee duties will be specified by the Chairman of the Section. It is normally expected that these duties will be chairing of committees, such as Memberships and Transfers, Public Relations, Program, Attendance and Special Activities.

Sec. 14. Any vacancy occurring during the year shall be filled by the Chairman for the remainder of the unexpired term, subject to approval by the Executive Committee.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Sec. 15. A Nominating Committee of the Section shall be selected by the Chairman at least three months prior to the coming annual election. It shall not consist of any of the present officers or Executive Committee, and should be composed of at least three members of the Section. The Chairman of the Nominating Committee shall preferably be a past chairman of the Section.

Sec. 16. The slate of officers selected by the nominating committee must be presented to the membership at least 30 days prior to the election. Write-in nominations must be submitted at least 14 days prior to the election and must be seconded by four eligible voting members. Such nominations will appear on the ballot with the slate selected by the nominating committee.

Sec. 17. Officers and the additional members of the Executive Committee shall be elected by the ballot of the members present at the Annual Meeting.

Sec. 18. Only Fellows, Senior Members, and Members of the Institute residing within the territory of the Section shall be entitled to vote.

Sec. 19. Members eligible to vote and who cannot attend the election may request an absentee ballot in writing to the Secretary of the section not less than 14 days prior to the election. The absentee ballot shall be returned to the Secretary (not less than two days prior to the election) in a plain sealed envelope, enclosed in an outer sealed envelope, marked "Ballot" which bears the signature of the voting member.

MEETINGS

Sec. 20. Unless otherwise ordered by the Executive Committee, meetings shall be held monthly from October to June.

Sec. 21. Special meetings may be called at any time by the Executive Committee upon written notice thereof being sent out in advance of the meeting.

Sec. 22. The Annual Meeting shall be held during the month of May. At this meeting the result of the vote for officers for the ensuing year shall be announced, and such other business transacted as should properly come before the Annual Meeting or as the Executive Committee may refer to it.

COMMITTEES

Sec. 23. In addition to the Nominating Committee, the Chairman shall appoint such standing and special committees as may be considered desirable, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.

Sec. 24. The Terms of all committees shall coincide with those of the Section Officers.

DUES

Sec. 25. Institute members shall be exempt from the payment of local dues.

PAPERS

Sec. 26. The Section shall assist in maintaining at Institute headquarters a reference file of the papers presented at meetings of the Section, and to this end the Section Secretary shall forward to the Secretary of the Institute the manuscripts of such papers, whenever available.

GENERAL

Sec. 27. Ten percent of the voting members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at all meetings. A quorum may be waived, however, at meetings where the proceedings do not require a vote to be taken.

Sec. 28. A majority shall constitute a quorum at all committee meetings.

Sec. 29. The Chairman in office at the time the Annual Convention of the Institute is held shall be the official delegate of the Section to the convention held during his term of office. In the event the Chairman's absence or inability to attend, his place shall be filled by the Chairman-Elect or delegate previously designated by the vote of the Executive Committee.

Sec. 30. The expense of social features shall be paid for from local funds raised through subscription or otherwise, such expenses not being chargeable to the Institute.

Sec. 31. In order to provide for the proper handling of the Section's routine work and the management of its affairs the Executive Committee may adopt in connection with these by-laws such rules and regulations as may be found necessary but no rule or regulation should be adopted which will conflict with these by-laws or with the Constitution and By-laws of the Institute.

Sec. 32. These by-laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any meeting provided that notice of the proposed amendment has been sent to all members of the Section at least one week in advance of the meetings, and further provided, that the proposed amendment or amendments have received the approval of the Institute's Sections Committee in advance of their submission to the membership.

REPORT OF IEEE BY-LAWS COMMITTEE

The By-Laws Committee composed of the following members submits the attached by-laws for the Louisville Section of the IEEE for consideration by the Executive Committee of the two merging societies, AIEE and IRE.

The basic structure of the two societies have been retained. The major changes proposed are these:

1. The provision of a new Officer, the Chairman-Elect who assists the Chairman, prepares himself for the chairmanship and automatically succeeds the Chairman.
2. Making the Chairman of the Student Branch a member of the Executive Committee and eliminating the Executive Committee position of "Student Activities". It is our feeling this will provide for a much stronger tie between the students and the members and will help promote the students continued interest in the Section after graduation.
3. Making definite provisions for the appointment, and composition of a Nominating Committee to recommend candidates for election.

In Sections 2, 7, and 18 the grades of "Fellows, Senior Members, and Members" are mentioned as requirements for membership, holding office, and voting. It is assumed at this time that these grades will be bona fide grades of the National IEEE and that we will not be in conflict with the Constitution and By-Laws of the Institute.

It is our recommendation that for this first election the provision of Section 15 with respect to a Nominating Committee be disregarded. We suggest that the present Chairman of AIEE and IRE appoint at least 4 members to the Nominating Committee, two from each organization.

By-Laws Committee

The rules governing the special election of officers for the initial term of office of IEEE, Louisville Section, are approved as follows:

1. The proposed nomination for officers shall be as follows:

Chairman:	- J. R. Bell
Chairman-Elect:	- Orrin W. Towner
Secretary:	- Harry Geisen
Treasurer:	- Donald J. Scheer
Executive Committee:	- C. C. Tiska
Executive Committee:	- A. Pelligrini
Executive Committee:	- J. S. Heintsman
Executive Committee:	- D. R. Fredericksen
Executive Committee:	- <i>J. C. Stites</i>

2. The proposed nominations shall be submitted to the membership of each society not less than thirty (30) days prior to the date of the special election.

3. Additional nominations from the general membership shall be received by the Committee if postmarked or delivered by hand to either Chairman on or before the 14th day prior to the date of the special election. To be accepted the nomination shall be in writing, shall state the name of the person nominated and the office for which he is being nominated, be signed by the person making the nomination and co-signed by four (4) eligible members as seconding. The person being nominated shall be qualified to hold office under the section by-laws and be willing to serve if elected. Such duly qualified nominations shall be added to the above slate and become nominations of the Committee.

4. On the official notification of nominees, the method of submitting additional nominees shall be explained.

5. No further nominations shall be accepted except as provided for herein above.

6. The officers shall be elected by secret ballot at a regular or special joint meeting of both societies in December, 1962. Notification of this meeting shall be mailed to the membership not less than seven (7) days prior to the meeting. It is anticipated that this election will be at the December Merger (or Christmas) Dance.

7. Members eligible to vote, but who cannot attend the election, may request an absentee ballot in writing to the Secretary of the society to which he belongs not less than fourteen (14) days prior to the election and shall return it in a plain, sealed envelope to the Secretary not less than two (2) days prior to the election or three (3) days after receipt whichever is later.

8. Persons who are members of both societies shall be eligible to cast only a single vote.

9. The officers shall assume their duties on January 1, 1963 and continue in office until ~~the annual meeting in May, 1964~~ *the annual meeting in May, 1964.*

10. The transfer of responsibilities from the existing organization's officers and committeemen to the newly elected officers and committeemen shall be in essence as outlined in the "Proposed Time Table for Merger", dated August 21, 1962, and attached hereto.

PROPOSED TIME-TABLE FOR MERGER

I. Follow the lead of headquarters.

- a) The IRE will merge their corporate body into the AIEE
- b) The AIEE will then change the name to IEEE
- c) A new constitution and set of by-laws (agreed on before a) and b) steps are taken) will be adopted
- d) The date for the above to be Dec. 31, 1962

II. Chairman

- a) The new chairman elected according to I(c) will take office Jan. 1, 1963. The immediate past chairman of each of the merged societies will assist him in any question for which he deems it necessary to request aid or advice.
- b) The new chairman will serve from Jan. 1, 1963 to May 31, 1964.

III. Secretary

- a) Same as for chairman (Section II).

IV. Treasurer

- a) The AIEE & IRE treasurers will meet before Dec. 15, 1962 to choose a bank for the IEEE account.
- b) Each of the present treasurers will prepare a treasurer's report as of Dec. 31, 1962.
- c) On Wed., Jan. 2, 1963, the present treasurers of IRE and AIEE will meet with the newly elected treasurer of IEEE. The following shall then take place:

- (1) The newly elected treasurer of IEEE will open an account at a bank previously agreed upon by the outgoing AIEE & IRE treasurers in IV (a).
- (2) In accordance with I (a) the IRE outgoing treasurer will transfer his funds to the AIEE outgoing treasurer.
- (3) In accordance with I(b) the AIEE outgoing treasurer will transfer his funds to the new created IEEE account of IVc(1).

V. Programs

- a) The present program chairman of AIEE and IRE will continue to act and be responsible for alternate programs until May, 1963. That is, the AIEE present program chairman will be responsible to obtain programs for Jan. and March, 1963. The present IRE program chairman will be responsible for the program for Feb. and April, 1963.
- b) On May 1, 1963, the new IEEE program chairman shall assume complete responsibility for all programs until his elected term ends or until relieved by the chairman of IEEE.

VI. Publicity

- a) The present public relations chairman of AIEE will be responsible for publicity on the Jan., 1963 meeting (or meetings).
- b) The new public relations chairman of IEEE will officially be responsible for publicity on all meetings held after Feb. 1, 1963.

VII. All Other Executive Committee Members

- a) All other executive committee members shall assume full responsibility of their assigned duties on Jan. 1, 1963.

We are pleased to note from your letter of March 27 that you are interested in the formation of an I. R. E. Section in Louisville, Kentucky.

The first step is the determination of the boundary. After the boundary has been decided, the next step is to write out a petition stating the boundaries for the Section. This petition must be signed by not fewer than 25 members as specified in Section 38 of the Constitution. Your petition, if found to be in good order, will then be presented to the next meeting of the Executive Committee, which would probably recommend the formation of a new Section to the Board of Directors who would act upon it at their meeting the next day.

When the new Section has been authorized by the Board of Directors and your officers elected in accordance with the Section Constitution, you are then eligible for a rebate of \$0.75 per member per year for every member in your Section up to 700 and \$0.90 per year for every member over 700. In addition, the Section is entitled to a rebate of \$10.00 per meeting per year up to a maximum of ten meetings per year.

Our records indicate that we now have sixteen members residing in Louisville. This means that you need nine members more. We hope you will be successful in securing these additional members.

A supply of membership application forms is being forwarded to you under separate cover, and if we can be of any further assistance to you in this matter, please do not hesitate to call upon us.

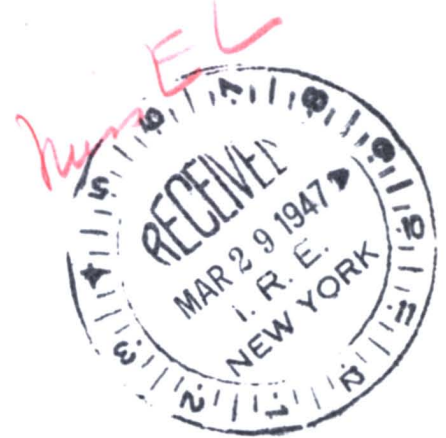

~~Art. 11-12~~ Sec. 14 - Applications for admission or transfer ~~to any grade of~~ membership, except to Fellow or Special Member, shall be addressed to the Board of Directors and submitted to the Institute office. Election or transfer of an applicant to any grade, except Fellow or Special Member, shall be made by a two-thirds affirmative vote of the Board membership voting, or a two-thirds affirmative vote of a committee of Board members duly authorized in the Bylaws to act for the Board in electing members or transferring their membership grades.

~~Art. 11-15~~ Sec. 16 - A reapplication for admission or transfer to a ~~particular~~ higher grade may be made by the applicant after the expiration of one year from the date of a rejection.

7 Sec. 21 - Admission or transfer to ~~any~~ a higher grade except Fellow or Special Member may be proposed by any member acting as sponsor, or by the Membership Committee, by supplying to the Admissions Committee sufficient information and testimonials from the required number of references to satisfy the Admissions Committee as to qualifications. Such proposals shall be acted upon by the Admissions Committee, and if approved, transmitted to the Executive Committee for their action. If approved by the Executive Committee, an Invitation Blank shall be sent to the proposed member inviting him to accept the grade of membership proposed, which membership grade shall become effective automatically and immediately upon his supplying the biographical and professional information required, and paying the necessary dues and fees. The name of an invitee shall be placed on the mailing list for the PROCEEDINGS immediately upon receipt of dues and fees. The proposal and invitation blanks shall be drawn up by the Membership Committee so as to avoid unconstitutional action due to the ~~reference~~ reference supplying incorrect information.
