IEEE Incorporated and Bonneville Power Adminstration (on behalf of IEEE Portland (Oregon) Section)

This is to make you aware of a developing situation, and to ask several questions related to same.

The IEEE Portland (Oregon) Section called last week asking whether it would be proper for them to be in a competitive bidding situation with commercial entities. They have proposed, to the U.S. Dept. of Energy/Bonneville Power Adminstration to present a class in "C" Programming. This class would be offered at BPA and would not be limited to IEEE members.

I discussed this issue with Rudi Stampfl, who advised that it was appropriate for the Section to do the proposal, but that it needed to be understood that any contract would be between IEEE Inc. (incorporated in the State of New York) and BPA. I advised Portland Section Chairman Clay Fouts, and past Chairmen Jamie Austin of this condition. I also asked that they send us background information and a copy of the proposal. Their response is attached.

Rudi and I reviewed the material to the best of our ability, and provided several comments to the Section:

- * Confirmed the necessity of IEEE Inc. as signature (Fax, P.2).
- * Recommended that minutes of Portland Section Executive Committee (P.3) not be included in proposal.
- * Suggested to Portland Section that a memorandum of understanding between IEEE Inc. and the Portland Section be prepared. This document should explain how the money is to be used (breakdown as noted in minutes would be sufficient). Rudi indicated that there might be a percentage due to IEEE Inc. (8%?) as a kind of handling charge. Please let me know, and I'll advise the Section.
- * (Fax, P. 5). Noting that the proposal and probably the contract, if bid accepted, requires a single figure, we will reiterate importance of memorandum. Otherwise, the entire \$7,000 would go to the Section, and instructors, book and other costs wouldn't be broken out cleanly.
- * (Fax, p. 6) Confirmed the Taxpayer Identification Number with Dave Galicki.

* (Fax, P. 7) We recommended that Portland Section add the publisher and copyright date of text, and more details on course evaluation, to the "Statement of Work" portion of the proposal.

If the proposal is accepted, a contract will be prepared immediately. The course is scheduled to begin March 19, 1990.

There were several related questions raised by the officers for which I'd appreciate your response (or guidance as to who I should call).

Portland Section plans to invite a local university faculty member to audit the course, in order to monitor level of quality. They asked if IEEE has a "national auditor" or other program through which an audit could be done.

The course instructor is an active PACE member. Because the Section questioned the propriety of offering the course on behalf of Section, he was concerned that the course might not be offered. He indicated that if the Section could not sponsor it, he would go through PACE. She is concerned, and wants to know if PACE is proper channel, or "if he could do this?" I sense a hidden agenda in her question, but don't have enough information to frame my response.

Thank you for your response to these questions, and any guidance you can provide.

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



Status of Nominating Committee Work

As I prepare for the Executive Committee meeting tonight, I remain concerned about the progress of the Nominating Committee work.

The constitution of the committee was confirmed by me in August and published in the September issue of BEEEP, with you named as Chair.

At the regular meeting of the Executive Committee in November, you reported that the committee was still at work and that it was not ready with a report.

After I monitored some irregularities surrounding the committee operation, I requested you to convene the committee on an emergency basis, for me to meet with the committee and review its assignment and obligations of stewardship therein. Your verbal attributions, which were not acknowledged, intensified my desire to meet face-to-face with the committee in an attempt minimize possible errors.

You left one telephone message with my voice mail that you were not able to get the committee to meet. However, that same afternoon, I found that four of you, out of five, were in towm and were ready to meet at your call. I also found that one member had never gotten any correspondence from you regarding the committee activities. Not all the committee members had had the opportunity to participate in the decisions being reported on behalf of the committee. They recall one luncheon meeting being held; one member was not ntified about the meeting.

Not having heard from you pursuant to my request, I have concluded that you are not maintaining proper communications with me in relation with critical committee work. If you are having any problems, the poor communication makes it difficult for me to assist as incumbent Section Chairperson in diagnosing the problem in a timely manner and applying suitable remedies.

I have refrained from bugging you unnecessarily. I am sure you understand what my request to you was. Needless to say that there appears to be an unwillingness on your part to communicate status and coordinate progress in a timely manner. It is not in the best interest of the organization to keep the chairperson in the dark especially when schedules are slipping. There is no problem we cannot handle, by the grace of God.

I would like the meeting tonight to be as short as possible as December meetings have traditionally been. So I am requesting committee chairs to coordinate their needs with me ahead of time. END

Dr Ogbuobiri:

Please refer to your memorandum to me dated December 2, 1991, and our telephone conversation of 19 November 1991.

I am replying to your memorandum by paragraph.

There is, and was, no reason for you to be concerned about the progress of the Nominating Committee's work. As I told you at the Executive Committee meeting you referred to, the Committee met first on 18 Sep 1991. I called all of the members; Don Mc Lemore was not present because he hadn't received my message.

There is no question about the membership of the Committee.

The first formal discussion of the Nominating Committee's activities at the Executive Committee meeting in November indicated that two people who had originally agreed to serve in the Section Offices had changed their minds. It was therefore necessary to find two others who were not only willing to serve but acceptable under the bylaws. This proved to be difficult. That was the report, and I did not indicate the Committee had no report.

During the period between the original meeting of the Committee and the report I faxed to you on 11/19/91 at 07:44 am, there were no "irregularities" for you to monitor. You requested that I convene the Committee on an emergency basis when you received the Committee report and discovered the Committee had followed the bylaws and tradition by nominating the candidates in succession. I don't understand your reference to verbal attribution, but the members of the Committee did not wish to meet with anyone outside of the Committee. I am sure you know that my style of leadership is to not stifle debate or dissent; if the Committee had wished to meet with you, we would have. I do not understand your meaning when you say you wished to minimize possible errors.

As you noted, one Committee member was out of town. Chet Taylor, the Region 6 Director Elect, was at an IEEE meeting in San Francisco. The Committee perceiving no emergency, I elected to wait until all five of its members were available. At this point, you should note that four of the five Committee members participated in the original meeting, and the original decision; that is the number you deemed adequate for the "emergency" meeting you requested.

I called once after your request, and told you there would be no

emergency meeting. There were no poor communications.

It appears from our referenced telephone conversation, and your reaction to the original Committee report, that your main concern was that the Nominating Committee did not choose to nominate you for a second term as Chairperson. The reasons you gave for wanting a second term, namely that the Section was not accustomed to the reorganization, and that the Nominating Committee's original nominee for Chair did not support your reorganization, and did not have enough experience, are really not adequate justification for a radical departure from the bylaws and tradition.

The reorganization of the Oregon Section has proceeded well. I believe, as do most of the other officers (including the original nominee), that your ideas have been brilliant. The Section has been well served by those ideas.

However, as you know, other leaders have also served IEEE well. Their best ideas survived their terms in office, as will yours. Our predecessor leaders in IEEE wisely determined that the members best interests would be served by a mix of those ideas, and a succession of leaders with varied interests, experience and leadership skills to apply the ideas and use them to build a unified Institute composed of willing, motivated volunteers. The Institute does not motivate volunteers by promising them an opportunity to reach the apex of leadership, and then denying that promise.

Your remarks regarding nominees qualifications are unfortunate. A nominee that has headed a large and important Society Chapter has no need for validation by the Section Chairperson. The Society members are more than capable of removing an unsatisfactory officer. I have been active in the Section for several years, and I have heard no complaints against any of our Society officers.

The Nominating Committee met again on 25 November 1991, as you know. A majority of the Committee voted to nominate you as well as Mr Dan Garigan. I cannot congratulate you, because in my view the influence exerted to achieve your nomination for a second, consecutive term as Chairperson was improper.
