TOLEDO SECTION MERGER AGREEMENT

This is the agreement of the Toledo Section AIEE and the Toledo Section IRE to merge into the Toledo Section IEEE.

In accordance with Draft No. 1 of the IEEE Sections' Manual, dated January 1963, the Territory of the Toledo Section IEEE is in Region 4 of IEEE and includes the counties of Lenawee and Monroe in Michigan, and the counties of Fulton, Henry, Lucas, Ottawa, Sandusky, Seneca, and Wood in Ohio.

The Toledo Section IEEE is automatically governed by the following articles:

IEEE Constitution, Revision 3, March 8, 1962

IEEE By-Laws, Approved by Board of Directors, January 8, 1963.

Any paragraph of this agreement found to be in violation of the above articles shall be automatically void.

The following paragraphs will govern the operation of the Toledo Section IEEE for the 1963-64 term or until the IEEE Section Constitution and/or By-Laws have been approved by the Toledo Section IEEE membership.

Officers of the Section shall be a Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer.

The governing body of the Section shall be the Executive Committee consisting of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, six Directors, the Junior Past Chairman of AIEE and the Junior Past Chairman of IRE.

The suggested organization and duties of the Executive Committee are shown in a block chart which is a part of this agreement.

By February 1, 1963, a nominating committee shall be appointed in accordance with the present By-Laws or Constitution of AIEE and IRE to consist of eight (8) members, four (4) AIEE and four (4) IRE.

(continued)

The Nominating Committee shall propose a ticket consisting of one candidate for Chairman, one candidate for Vice-Chairman, one candidate for Secretary, one candidate for Treasurer, and six candidates for Director.

Directors on the Executive Committee total six (6) in number, hold two-year terms, three (3) directors being elected each year. For the 1963-64 term the six directors will be accounted for, as follows:

Three Directors to be elected for a one-year term. Three Directors to be elected for a two-year term.

The Nominating Committee shall notify the secretaries of AIEE and IRE of its nominees for each office not later than March 25, 1963. The ticket proposed by the Nominating Committee shall be published to the membership of each section not later than April 1, 1963.

Nominations for any or all offices may be made by petition subject to the following provisions:

- (a) Such petition or petitions must bear the personal signatures of ten voting members of the Section.
- (b) Petitions proposing the names of eligible candidates as independent nominations for the various offices must be received by the Secretary of AIEE not later than April 15, 1963, or at the April 1963 meeting of IRE.

Announcement of all official nominees for each office shall be made at the April 1963 meeting of IRE and by mail by April 25, 1963, to all members of AIEE and IRE.

The election of officers for the 1963-64 term of Toledo Section IEEE shall be held at a joint general meeting of AIEE-IRE in May 1963. This election may be by voice vote or by ballot as directed by the Executive Committees of AIEE and IRE.

Duly elected officers and directors shall assume their duties on July 1, 1963. Officers shall hold office for a period of one year and directors for two years or until their successors take office.

(continued)

By June 30, 1963, the respective treasurers of each Section shall have their financial records complete and up-to-date. Between July 1 and July 15, 1963, the Merger Committee will call a meeting of the treasurers of AIEE and IRE and the newly elected treasurer of IEEE, and other necessary officers, for the purpose of merging the financial assets of AIEE and IRE into IEEE.

It is hoped this agreement will permit efficient operation of the Toledo Section IEEE for the interim period of 1963-64. If problems arise that cannot be resolved in the Executive Committee they may be referred to the Merger Committee for recommendations, as long as the Merger Committee is active.

As soon as practicable the Executive Committee of the Toledo Section IEEE will appoint a committee to prepare a Section Constitution and/or By-Laws for the approval of the Section Membership.

The Toledo Section, through Mr. Marvin W. Reck's letter of April 13, 1943, has requested the Detroit Section to grant permission for the transfer of three Michigan Counties, Hillsdale, Lenawee and Monroe, from the Detroit Section to the Toledo Section.

At the May meeting of the Executive Committee of the Detroit Section which was attended by Mr. A. R. Bitter, representing the Toledo Section, the request was carefully discussed. It was agreed that the question would be most appropriately handled by taking a vote of the IRE members resident in the three counties in question.

Accordingly, the Executive Committee of the Detroit Section directed the Secretary to ask the New York Office of the Institute to conduct such a vote, with the understanding that the Institute's interpretation of the results of the balloting will be accepted by both the Detroit and the Toledo Sections. Although the number of members involved is very small, this procedure seems to be in line with past practices.


We enclose a chart prepared by the Toledo Section showing the counties in question together with a list of the towns.
