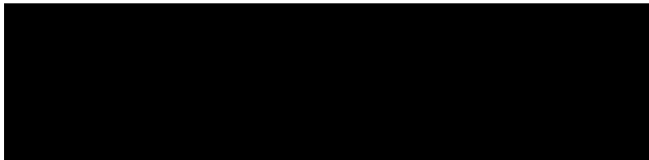

Dear Dr. Noble:

The Sacramento Section IEEE became a functioning entity on January 1, 1963, and through June held ten duly reported meetings. The Section was constituted by action of the Executive Committees of the parent IRE and AIEE Sections on November 20, 1962, when they adopted the "Report, IRE-AIEE Merger Committee" dated October 31, 1962. The report provides that the new section would take over the membership and monies of the parent sections and would operate under the direction of the parent Section Chairman acting as Co-chairmen pending election of new officers in May. Much of this action has been reported to you. It is the purpose of this letter to draw all of the necessary final actions of merger into one report.

### Officers

Section and Sub-section officers for the period June 1963 through May 1964 have been duly elected and are tabulated on Attachment 1.

### Boundaries

The territory of the Sacramento Section IEEE comprises the territory of the parent Sacramento IRE and AIEE Sections with certain adjustments.

1. As reported to you in Mr. Levis' letter of March 11, 1963, the San Francisco Section AIEE transferred their Shasta and Reno Sub-sections to us, together with the California counties of Trinity, Stanislaus, and Tuolumne. That portion of Solano County which was under the jurisdiction of the Sacramento Section IRE was transferred to the San Francisco Section.

2. By verbal agreement with Jens J. Johnsson, representing the Utah Section at the Sixth Regional Committee Meeting on April 26, 1963, we transferred Eureka County, Nevada, to the Utah Section. This action was reported verbally to John F. Byrne at San Diego. Eureka County, Nevada, was in the Sacramento Section IRE.
3. By our letter of June 21, 1963, to Dolan P. Hume, we transferred Esmeralda County, Nevada, to the Las Vegas Section IEEE. Esmeralda County, Nevada, was in the Sacramento Section IRE and was within that portion of the San Francisco Section AIEE transferred to us.

The net territory of the Sacramento Section IEEE as we understand it is detailed on Attachment 2.

### Financial Condition

The financial condition of the Section as determined by a member of the Section acting as an Audit Committee on June 14, 1963, appears on Attachment 3. Not reflected in this report of audit is the fact that there are several outstanding bills totalling about \$448.

### Section Constitution

A Section Constitution was duly adopted by a 225 to 2 vote in favor of the following Proposition which appeared on the May ballot:

The "IEEE Constitution for Sections" as prescribed by the National IEEE Executive Committee and printed in the "Section Manual, IEEE" is adopted as, and shall be the Constitution of the Sacramento Section of The Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, Inc.

Please let me know if there is any other action in connection with merger which we should take, or additional information that I can provide.

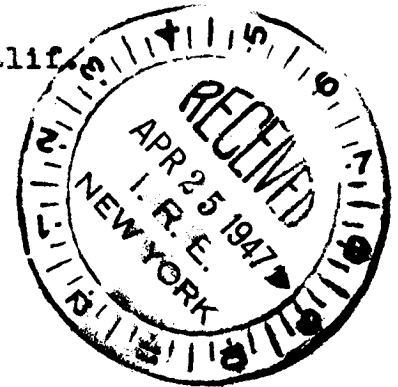

The San Francisco Section used to include all of Nevada, except one county, and all of Utah. Sacramento has taken over all the Nevada territory that formerly belonged to San Francisco, thus completely isolating Utah from the rest of San Francisco's territory. I wonder if this fact was realized by San Francisco when they gave up Nevada?

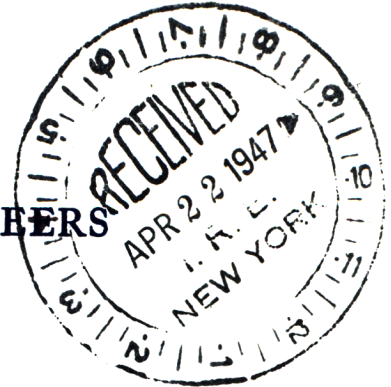
- 1.- We have been attending meetings of the Sacramento Group which is only twenty miles away.

The San Francisco Section has been unable to properly serve the members in the Sacramento area due to the distance involved and is glad that they will now have a convenient location for meetings.

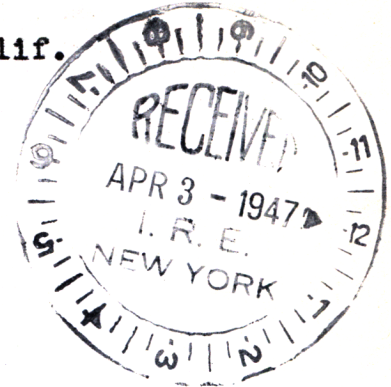

This will also acknowledge receipt of a package containing application blanks, Section Manual, and other items for operation of the Section.

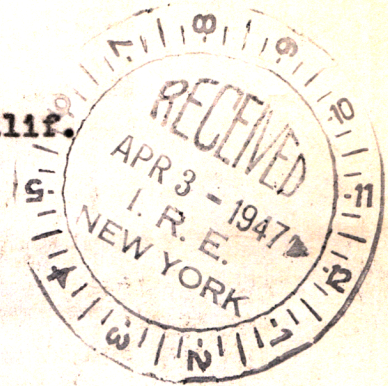

Since speaking with you in San Francisco last Friday, I have been notified by G. W. Bailey, Executive Secretary, under date of March 18, 1947 that the Board of Directors of the IRE on March 4, 1947 had unanimously approved a resolution to establish a Sacramento Section.

Our petition for formation of the Sacramento Section carried the names of the following counties:- Sacramento, Stanislaus, Tuolumne, Calaveras, Alpine, San Joaquin, Amador, El Dorado, Yolo, Nevada, Placer, Yuba, Sutter, Butte, Glenn, Colusa, Sierra, Plumas, Tehama, Lassen, Shasta, Siskiyou, and Modoc within the State of California, and the entire State of Nevada with the exception of Clark County. Dear Mr. Bailey,

I am transmitting herewith a petition for the formation of a new Section of the IRE to be known as the Sacramento Section. The petition contains twenty eight (28) signatures.

I wish to call your attention to the fact that the petition includes the county of Solano which an inspection of the proper map will show stretches out along the main highway between Sacramento and San Francisco so that its extremes are within twenty miles of the two cities. The road mileage between the two cities is approximately 100 miles. You will note that the petition contains a number of signatures of members residing at Dixon, Solano County, Calif. Dixon is located twenty miles west of Sacramento in the extreme northeast corner of Solano County. It should also be pointed out that there are a number of members located at Vallejo, Solano County, California which is only about thirty three (33) miles from San Francisco. I do not believe that those members in Vallejo would be favorable toward being included in the proposed new Sacramento Section.

Therefore, I am proposing, after discussion with other members in this area, that Solano County be divided between the two Sections by appropriate township lines. I believe that the following townships should be included in the Sacramento Section: Vacaville, Silveyville in which Dixon is located, Tremont, Elmira, Main Prairie, Rio Vista, Denverton, and Montezuma. Such a division, I believe, would be consistent with the "natural travel habits of the residents of the area in question."

I trust that you will find the petition in proper order for the consideration of the Board of Directors and hope to hear from you further in the very near future.

We still have a number of prospective members in this area who are waiting for application blanks. I would appreciate receiving another supply in the near future.
