CONSTITUTION FOR ITHACA SECTION DESTITUTE OF RADIO ENGINEERS

1.1.1. Name and Object

- 1.1.1.1. This organization shall be known as the Tekaca Section of the Institute of Radio Engineers, Inc.
- 1.1.1.2. The Section shall strive for the advancement of the theory and practice of radio engineering and of the allied arts and sciences, and the maintenance of a high professional standing among its members, all in consonance with the Constitute and Bylaws of the Institute and with special attention to such aims within the territory of the Section as are hereinafter defined.
- 1.1.1.3. The Section shall aid in promoting close cooperation and good fellowship among its members and to this end shall hold meetings for the transaction of the regular business of the section and for the presentation of papers and their discussion.

1.1.2. Membership

- 1.1.2.1. All members of the Institute residing within the territory of the Section are automatically members of this Section. There shall be no other grades of membership.
- 1.1.2.2. All Fellows, Senior Members, and Members of the Institute residing within the territory of the Section shall be entitled to attend the meetings, vote and hold office. Associates of the Institute residing in the territory of & Section shall be entitled to attend meetings, vote and hold office, except the officers of Chairman and Vice-Chairman.
- 1.1.2.3. Student members of the Institute shall be entitled to attend meetings but shall not have the right to vote or hold office.

1.1.3. Territory

1.1.3.1. The territory of the Section shall be set by the Board of Directors, and may be enlarged, reduced, or other wise altered by the Board at any time.

- 1.1.3.2. Whenever within a Scotion, circumstances arise which indicate the need for meetings in different areas, it shall be permissible for the Section to foster and inaugurate one or more Sub-Sections locally to carry out the function of obtaining speakers and holding meetings.
- 1.1.3.3. A Sub-Section may be formed and operated on any plan not inconsistent with the powers of the Executive Committee.

1.1.4. Dues

- 1.1.4.1. There shall be no Section dues.
- 1.1.4.2. The ordinary expenses of the Section shall be defrayed by the funds supplied by the Institute.
- 1.1.4.3. Emergency or extraordinary expenses may be provided for by voluntary contribution from the membership of the Section. A unanimous vote of the Executive Committee is required before such a request may be made.
- 1.1.4.4. The Section may require non-members, who wish to be placed on the mailing list for notices, to pay in advance for the estimated cost of such notices.

1.1.5. Officers

- 1.1.5.1. The officers of the Section shall be a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman, a Secretary, and a Treasurer, but any Section may combine the offices of Secretary and Treasurer in one person.
- 1.1.5.2. The terms of office for all officers shall begin at the close of the annual meeting, or as soon thereafter as the election result is determined, and shall end at the close of the next annual meeting, or as soon thereafter as the result of the election of new officers is determined, and in any case continue until their successors are duly elected and take office.
- 1.1.5.3. The terms of office set forth above shall be approximately one year and may exceed this interval only in the case where the date of the annual meeting is being changed and a continuation in office is necessary to effect the new schedule, or no successor has been elected or appointed.

1.1.6. Management

1.1.6.1. There shall be an Executive Committee consisting of at least the officers, the junior past chairman, and the chairman of all the standing committees listed in 1.1.6.5.

The Chairman may appoint, subject to confirmation by a majority vote of the above members of the Executive Committee, additional members to the Executive Committee from the Section Membership.

- 1.1.6.2. The Chairman, responsible to the Executive Committee, shall have general supervision of the affairs of the Section. He shall preside at meetings of the Section and the Executive Committee and have such other powers and perform such other duties as may be provided for in the Bylaws, or as may be delegated to him by vote of the Section. In his absence his duties shall be performed by the Vice-Chairman.
- 1.1.6.3. The <u>freasurer or Secretary-Treasurer</u> shall receive and deposit all monies in the Name of the Section in such depository as shall be determined by the Executive Committee. He shall make only such disbursements as shall be ordered by the Executive Committee.
- 1.1.6.4. The Secretary or Secretary-Treasurer shall send out notices, prepare the agenda for, and record the minutes of all meetings of the Section and of the Executive Committee. He shall make such reports of his activities as may be required by the Executive Committee of the Institute.
- 1.1.6.5. The Chairman, as soon as expedient after the annual meeting, shall appoint the following standing committees:

Meetings and Papers Committee Membership Committee Publicity Committee

Members appointed shall serve until their successors are appointed or the committee dissolved.

Other committees may be authorized by vote of the Section at any regular meeting, and shall be appointed by the Chairman of the Section.

1.1.6.6. The Chairman, shall, when notified of the annual meeting of the committee on Sections, arrange for representation of his Section at such annual meeting by himself or by some member of his Section or he shall forward a letter to the Committee Chairman explaining inability to provide representation and giving the views of his Section on the agenda or proposals before the meeting.

Failure to comply with the above shall be punishable by a fine of \$10, to be deducted from the rebates to the Section. Sections so remotely located as to make the requirements unusually difficult, may be excused by the Sections Committee from these penalties.

The above penalty shall not be exacted if the Chairman of the Sections Committee shall fail to forward to each Section Chairman and Secretary, or Secretary-Treasurer, at least firty-five days in advance of the date of the annual meeting of the Sections Committee, notice of that meeting and the agenda to be considered thereat.

1.1.7. Momination and Election of Officers.

1.1.7.1. All officers shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Section.

Not later than one month before the meeting preceding the annual meeting, the Chairman of the Section shall appoint a Mominating Committee of three members not then officers of the Section.

The nominations submitted by the Bominating Committee shall be annual meeting. At this same meeting nominations also may be made from the floor when supported by a petition signed by at least 10 per cent or 10 voting members, whichever is less, qualified to vote for the office of the candidate nominated.

All nominations shall be announced in the notice of the annual meeting.

1.1.7.2. When et an annual meeting there is more than one nominee for any one of the offices of Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer or Secretary-Treasurer, the Chairman of the Section may conduct the election at the annual meeting if it is evident that a fair expression

of the wishes of the membership can be then determined. As an alternative, he may announce that the results shall be determined by a letter ballot to be taken prior to the next regular meeting of the Section.

1.1.7.3. In the event that election of officers is to be determined by letter ballot, the Secretary or Secretary-Treasurer shall provide promptly to each voting member of the Section a letter ballot with return envelope as used by the Institute and with a return date specified, which shall in no case be later than six weeks after date of the annual meeting.

The Chairman shall call a meeting of the Executive Committee to count the vote and determine the successful candidates.

The Chairman shall inform the successful candidates of their election and arrange for the transfer of responsibility to the new officer without delay.

- 1.1.7.4. Vacancies in office occurring during the year shall be filled by the Executive Committee for the remainder of the unexpired term unless otherwise provided for.
- 1.1.7.5. If for any reason the best interests of the Section seem to require a change in the governing body during the year, the matter shall be duly and carefully considered by the Executive Committee.

 Upon not less than two-thirds vote of the Executive Committee, or upon receipt by the Executive Committee of a petition signed by fifteen members of the Section, recommendation shall be made to the Section for action at a special meeting to be duly called by the Executive Committee for the sole purpose of considering and voting upon such a change.

A two-thirds vote of the members present shall be necessary to declare an office vacant. Upon two-thirds vote of the members present the vacant office may be filled for the unexpired term upon nominations from the floor.

1.1.8. Meetings

- 1.1.8.1. The Section shall not hold less than five regular meetings during the year, one of which shall be an annual meeting.
- 1.1.8.2. These meetings shall be held at some specific time in the year as prescribed in the Section Bylaws.
- 1.1.8.3. The start of the fiscal year of the Sections shall coincide with the start of any one of the quarters of the fiscal year of the ν . Institute.
- 1.1.8.4. At least fifteen members shall be present to constitute a quorum at all meetings of the Section called for the transaction of regular business and requiring a vote to be taken, but a higher number may be set to constitute a quorum, such number to be determined by a Bylaw voted upon by the Section membership.
- 1.1.8.5. A majority of the votes cast, a quorom being present, is necessary for the election of officers.
- 1.1.8.6. Meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held at such times as shall be found necessary. Executive Committee meetings may be called by the Chairman of the Section at his own discretion or shall be at the request of the members of the committee.
- 1.1.8.7. A majority of the members of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of the Executive Committee, except as otherwise provided herein.
- 1.1.8.8. A majority vote of the Executive Committee shall be necessary in the conduct of its business except as otherwise provided in this Constitution or in the Section Bylaws.
- 1.1.8.9. The Secretary or Secretary-Treasurer shall send out notices of all regular Section meetings to all Institute members in the territory of the Section at least one week prior to the date of the meeting. These notices shall contain a full statement of the time, place and business of the meeting.

1.1.9. Sub-Sections

1.1.9.1. Sub-Sections shall be geographical sub-divisions of the Section and subject to the same limitations as the Section.

- 1.1.9.2. Sub-Section membership shall be limited to members, except students, of the Institute.
- 1.1.9.3. The territory of a Sub-Section shall be set by the Section Executive Committee within the territory of the Section.
- 1.1.9.4. All Sub-Sections shall be exclusively those of the Section. No joint Sub-Sections shall be recognized. Sub-Sections may cooperate with other organizations in holding joint meetings and may invite members of such organizations and the public to their meetings.
- 1.1.9.5. All Fellows, Senior Members, Members and Associates with mailing addresses within Sub-Section territory shall have voting privileges in Sub-Section activities.
- 1.1.9.6. Rules pertaining to the election of officers and other procedures shall be the same as for the Section.
- 1.1.9.7. The Section will furnish Sub-Sections with suitable stationery, membership blanks, Institute literature and necessary forms.
- 1.1.9.8. The Section shall pay to each Sub-Section a portion of the relate received from the Institute by the Section for each member with mailing address within Sub-Section territory. The portion shall be set by the Section Executive Committee.
- 1.1.9.9. A Sub-Section shall not have authority to contract debts for, pledge the credit of, or in any way bind the Section or the Institute.
- 1.1.9.10. A petition for the formation of a Sub-Section shall be submitted to the Section Executive Committee. The petition for the formation of the Sub-Section may be approved by the Section Executive Committee.
- 1.1.9.11. Sub-Sections may qualify for meeting allowances provided the petition is signed by not fewer than twenty Fellows, Senior Members, Members, or Associates with mailing addresses within the proposed territorial limits. A copy of this petition, together with copy of the motion passed by the Section or the Section Executive Committee approving the formation of a Sub-Section, and an accompanying letter signed by the Secretary or

Secretary-Treasurer of the Section attesting to the action, shall be forwarded to the Secretary of the Institute for the purpose of securing approval of the Executive Committee of the Institute.

1.1.9.12. A Sub-Section which has qualified for meeting allowances, upon failure to maintain a minimum of twenty resident members, other than students, and to hold at least three meetings each year, shall be placed on probation. All members of such Sub-Section shall be informed of the probation by the Section Secretary or Secretary-Treasurer, who shall call their attention to the requirements for meeting allowances. If delinquency continues for a second year, the Section Executive Committee shall notify the Secretary of the Institute that the Sub-Section is no longer qualified for meeting allowances.

1.1.9.13. The Secretary of each Sub-Section shall forward to the Secretary or Secretary-Treasurer of the Section a report of each meeting held by the Sub-Section for presentation or discussion of technical material. A yearly financial report shall be forwarded to the Secretary or Secretary-Treasurer of the Section which report shall be incorporated in the yearly report of the Section to the Institute. This financial report shall be submitted to the Section at a date suitable to the Section Executive Committee.

1.1.9.14. Ectices of Sub-Section meetings shall be mailed to the Chairman, Secretary or Secretary-Treasurer, and Chairman of the Program Committee of the Section, and to other members of the Section Executive Committee upon request.

1.1.9.15. The Chairman of each Sub-Section shall be ex-officio a member of the Section Executive Committee.

1.1.9.16. The Chairman of a Sub-Section qualified for meeting allowances shall be of member grade or higher.

1.1.10. Amendments

1.1.10.1. This Constitution may be smended by a two-thirds vote of all members present at any annual meeting of the Committee on Sections provided that notices of the proposed meeting and the proposed change

aliterations,

have been sent to all members of the Committee on Sections at least one month in advance of the meeting. Such action shall be subject to the approval of the Board of Directors of the Institute.

1.1.10.2. In the event of absence of any member of the Committee on Sections, he may vote by proxy on smendments to this Constitution.

1.1.10.3. Suitable Bylaws to this Constitution may be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the voting members present at any regular meeting, providing that notice of the proposed change has been sent to each voting member at least three weeks prior to such meeting. Such Bylaws must be consonant with the Constitution and Bylaws of the Institute and this Constitution. A copy of these Bylaws shall be filed in the Institute Office.
