Section shall become an Affiliated Society of Club and shall participate in Club support, benefits and privileges commensurate with its ability and according to the following terms and conditions:

REPRESENTATION:

Section shall appoint a Section member to the Board of Governors of Club and Section member to the standing Lectures and Papers Committee of Club. Each appointee must be a resident member of Club.

MIMBERSHIP:

Members of Section in good standing may become members of Club upon payment of dues without further endorsement. (Dues for Section members to be the difference between Club dues and the emount paid to Club by Section for each member.)

MEETINGS:

Section shall sponsor one joint meeting of Section and Club per year, open to all members of Section and Club per year, open to all members of Section and Glub. Expense of sponsored joint meeting shall be borne by Club as authorized by the chairman of its Paper and Lectures Committee. Club shall provide quarters and facilities for not exceeding 6 Section meetings per year at such times as shall be matually agreed upon by Club and Section. Notification to Section members, wheth r or not members of the Club, of all meetings, both joint and sectional, shall be provided by Club.

TIMANCIAL:

Section shall pay over to Club its antire income

every quarter, beginning September 1, 1947, encurting to \$0.70 per menter for approximately 160 members; plus \$10 per meeting for approximately 6 meetings, reserving 35% of the total for incidental Section meeting expenses up to a total of \$50, and 40% to defray one half of Club dues for approximately 28 resident Section members, who expect to become members of the Club. This number will be reviewed annually on June 50 and the rebate revised in proportion, but not to exceed 50% of the Club dues. Any unexpended funds revert at the end of the year to the Club treasury. The amount of the balance remaining in the 25% incidentals fund small be available at any time for examination by the Secretary-Treasurer of the Section.

TENURE:

This agreement shall become effective on September 1, 1947, and shall continue in effect until August 51, 1948 and year to year thereafter until canceled by Glub or Section upon written notice either to the other on or before June 50.

ADOPTION:

The signing of two copies of this agreement by the President and Secretary of Club and by Chairman and Secretary of Section shall constitute adoption.

Club shall provide quarters and facilities for not exceeding 6 Section meetings per year at such times as aball be mutually agreed upon by Club and Section. Notification to Section members, whether or not members of the Club, of all meetings, both joint and sectional, shall be provided by Club.

FINANCIAL:

Section shall pay over to Club its entire income

every quarter, beginning deptember 1, 1947, emcunting to \$0.75 per member for approximately 160 members; plus \$10 per meeting for approximately 6 meetings, reserving 25% of the total for incidental Section meeting expenses up to a total of \$50, and 40% to defray one half of Club dues for approximately 25 resident Section members, who expect to become members of the Club. This number will be reviewed annually on June 30 and the rebate revised in proportion, but not to exceed 50% of the Club dues. Any unexpended funds revert at the end of the year to the Club treasury. The amount of the balance remaining in the 25% incidentals fund shall be available at any time for exam-

TENURE:

This agreement shall become effective on September 1, 1947, and shall continue in effect until August 51, 1948 and year to year thereafter until canceled by Club or Section upon written notice either to the other on or before June 50.

ADOPTION:

The signing of two copies of this agreement by the President and Secretary of Club and by Chairman and Secretary of Section shall constitute adoption.





EXTRACT FROM THE CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE IX.

INSTITUTE SECTIONS AND BRANCHES.

54. Whenever, in the judgment of the Board of Directors, a sufficient number of Members and Associates shall petition, in writing, these members may form, subject to the Constitution and all By-laws and regulations which may be hereafter prescribed by the Board of Directors, a Section organization for the purpose of more effectually carrying out the aims of the INSTITUTE.

EXTRACTS FROM THE BY-LAWS.

SEC. 58. A petition for the formation of a Section shall be signed by not less than 25 members residing within the territorial limits hereinafter prescribed. The Board of Directors may decline to authorize the formation of a Section when in its judgment such an organization would not be compatible with the interests of the Institute.

SEC. 59. In the initial Section organization only petitioners shall have the right to vote.

Sec. 63. The territory of a Section shall include the locality naturally tributary thereto, but shall not include territory so remote or inaccessible that members cannot readily attend meetings. For the purpose of determining the maximum amount to which a Section is entitled under these By-laws, points more than sixty miles from the regular meeting place of the Section shall not be considered a part of that Section, except that, when special conditions warrant such action, additional territory within a reasonable distance may be authorized by the Board of Directors, upon application of the Executive Committee of the Section concerned, and the approval of the Sections and Finance Committees. If adjacent Sections are so situated that the sixty-mile limit embraces common territory, the question as to which Section may claim such members as reside within this common territory shall be decided by agreement between the Sections concerned.

SEC. 64. In addition to Institute members the section bylaws may admit other persons interested in engineering, who shall have all the Section privileges except those of voting and holding office.




