Dear Don:

In response to your letters of May 27th regarding failure of various Sections and Subsections to hold an adequate number of meetings I report the following.

I talked last night to Paul Uhlrich, new Chairman of the Montana Section, (he resides in Bozeman which is in the Helena Subsection.) The Student Branch at Bozeman is very active and there appears to have been some breakdown in the reporting system as regards meetings of the Montana Section and Billings Subsection. Uhlrich will make an effort to retrieve the data and make reports, but he is brand new in his job and obviously is not on top of it at this moment.

He and Bob Leo, Secretary/Treasurer of the Section, have already had one meeting with Beardslee and Gregg, outgoing officers of the Butte Section, and are already planning to meet with the officers of the other Subsections in order to stimulate an active year for 1970-1971. The Bylaws of the Section presently call for a calendar year operation, but in fact the Section operates on a June-to-June year and I have recommended that they alter the Bylaws to conform to their current practice.

I talked to John Lamb, Chairman of the Los Alamos-Santa Fe Subsection and they had one meeting last year which was a flop. Things are so bad at the Subsection that there were not even enough members active to make up a nominating committee last year with the result that Lamb has apparently served two years. John has agreed to do some poking around to see if he can revive interest in the Subsection and has promised to get back to me before the end of this month. My personal opinion is that the Subsection should be shut down but I must wait for Lamb's response before making such an overture to R.A.B.

I will get to Ray Banks for assistance on the Antelope Valley, San Fernando Valley and South Bay Harbor Sections and will try again next week to reach the Section Chairmen.

I shall keep you posted.




